CYBER PROTECT WEEKLY TIP

People are an organisation's biggest asset, however, in some cases they can also pose an insider risk. This week, a business in the West Midlands reported a network intrusion incident that was allegedly carried out by an ex-employee.

In a lot of ways, the home working arrangements coupled with lockdown have made businesses more susceptible to fraud and the unintentional leak of confidential information. Several challenges have emerged during this period such as:

- Staff cannot be monitored as closely whilst at home, making the risk of an accidental threat greater.
- Increase in opportunistic actors - Hackers often take advantage of times of crisis and increased anxiety across the population,
- Employee morale - Employees may feel more detached from the workplace while not in the office

A CPNI study found that there is a clear link between an insider act taking place and exploitable weaknesses in an employer's protective security and management processes. The organisational-level factors identified relate to:

- Poor management practices and security culture
- Poor use of auditing functions and a lack of protective security controls
- Lack of adequate, role-based, personnel security risk assessment
- Poor pre-employment screening and communication between business areas
- Lack of awareness of people risk at a senior level and inadequate corporate governance

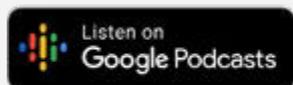
